Provides food, showers and laundry services for 100 to 150 families, both homeless and low-income clients who need assistance with food to supplement their resources.

Provides Thanksgiving dinner to both our regular clientele and delivered remaining dinner plates to various locations around the Island including Waianae, Mokapu, Bellows, Aala Park and other known homeless areas.

Provides Christmas gifts to children and their parents through donations including toys, clothing, cash cards, from Angel Network Charities and Hygienic supplies from Kamiloiki Elementary School who generously donated 400 gift wrapped boxes with soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, lotion, etc.

Refers clients to agencies that can offer rental assistance, utilities assistance and low-cost housing.

All donations come from churches and private individuals. Angel Network does not receive funding from the State of Hawaii. It is through the generosity of people like you, Angel Network Charities, Inc. can continue to help those in need.
